1. IPT Edinburgh/IPT Scotland Regional Report

In continuation of our developments we have now established IPT training at the University of Edinburgh, including IPT introductory training for IPT and IPT-A, as well as corresponding supervised practice courses, leading to practitioner standard and from later this year we also offer an annual supervision course, with supervised practice for practitioners to fulfil supervisor standards and criteria. This is offered as the IPT pathway of our MSc in psychological therapies and individuals can complete their IPT training as CPD or to degree level for a PG diploma and Masters degree in psychological therapies (IPT).

For some years now we also offer the full IPT introductory training as part of the Clinical Psychology Doctorate training programmes in Edinburgh and Glasgow, as part of this development we also identified IPT specific specialist placements in their third year of training which will allow some trainees on the doctorates to work towards practitioner status.

We are keen to grow the group of trainers and supervisors; NES has recently funded a number of practitioners to train to supervisor level which will go some way in addressing the bottleneck provided by lack of supervision capacity in NHS board areas. The funding came with funding for backfill to allow people the time to train and with an agreement that once accredited as supervisors people funded by NES will provide local supervision for colleagues in their board area to train as practitioners.

We are also training a number of new trainers who will hopefully submit their portfolios over the next 6 months, these are Emily Taylor and Katie Jane O'Kane. Joining the existing group of trainers, consisting of Fiona Duffy, Ricard Taylor, Patricia Graham, Morag Osborne, Lorna Champion, Pauline Hogarth and Matthias Schwannauer.

It is fair to say that IPT Scotland as a group of IPT practitioners and supervisors found it difficult to establish a clear organisational structure. It became established as a formal charity but due to key personnel changes and retirements etc. this was not sustainable. IPT Scotland is now again a special interest group which will provide annual CPD opportunity and facilitate IPT network meetings bi annually.

In recent years the IPT Scotland group and the group of trainers within it also acted as an accreditation group and have processed a number of practitioner and supervisor portfolios, these were all rated by two IPT trainers. As a result there are IPT practitioners and some IPT supervisors who may not have registered with IPT UK but have been accredited in good faith following the IPT UK criteria and joined the IPT Scotland register of practitioners and supervisors. A recent discussion of the IPT Scotland group found this to be unsustainable, especially in the context of IPT supervisors needing to be members of IPT UK for their supervision to be recognised by IPT UK.

I therefore bring a proposal from the IPT Scotland group for consideration that we merge the current IPT Scotland register with IPT UK registers of practitioners and supervisors and that from now on all IPT supervisors become accredited with IPT UK and join IPT UK as members to ensure their supervision and training of practitioners to follow the same standards as IPT UK.

Training was delivered by Roslyn Law, Yvonne Hemming (Step 2 manager) and Annie Waring (Step 2 supervisor)
RL and AW are on a steering group to develop a bid for a RfPB trial of IPC delivered by PWS as requested by the IAPT Action for Change Committee. The aim is to explore the potential to include IPC at Step 2. Several services have volunteered to participate in the trial if it is funded.

FB-IPT Supervision

3 therapists have been receiving weekly supervision from Laura Dietz on two cases each. One more had to drop out of this supervision.
RL is providing supervision for two more supervisors from the London and South Eats CYPIAPT course under Laura's continued supervision

CYP IAPT training 2017-2019

16 students started training in January. One has withdrawn due to changing post.
First part time course and first course with monthly face to face practice tutor groups.

AFNCCF has secured funding for national supervisor training for CYP IAPT and is developing a national programme of local champion sites. Stakeholder discussions are starting now.

AFNCCF Training

We continue to provide a full range of Practitioner, Supervisor and refresher training, with a new cohort of each currently in training.

RL continues to provide IAPT Practitioner and Supervisor training for North West and Yorkshire and Humberside trainees in NSCAP, Leeds.

RL was pleased to join the CYP IAPT training at University of Manchester to review Jamie Barsky completing his first solo training. Jamie successfully completed the training, with support from Kat Tidswell and completed his trainer accreditation. Congratulations, Jamie.

4. North-East regional report

IPT holds a consistent and steady interest in the North East. The bimonthly regional meetings show increasing attendance with the educational aspect well received. There are good contributions from a range of willing therapists. The details of this are in the table below. A colleague from NW (Jenny Stanford) is coming to the NE regional meeting to talk about her experiences of IPT in secondary care. This is a really nice opportunity to expand the use of regional networks and make the most of our skills nationally.

Courses summary:

- Courses conducted since Nov 2016 – 1 Practitioner course and 1 supervisor course
- Numbers attending – 8 on practitioner course and 3 on supervisor course
- Numbers progressing to training – all from above courses
- Numbers accredited since Nov 2016 – 8 practitioners and 1 supervisor

There was an IAPT IPT Practitioner course in March 2017 with 8 places taken.

The IPT supervisors course ran in March 2017 (with 4 funded places). This had to be rescheduled from November 2016 due to low number so applicants. There were 3 places taken.

The CYP IAPT IPT A training course did not get the numbers to run in 2017 as staff were not being released from organisations.

The local contact for HENE commissioner is about to leave and there is no alternate contact as yet. There has been a request for 12 practitioner and 4 supervisor training places for next year but no confirmation as yet this has been funded. Maintaining interest and momentum to apply for training places is an issue.

7. Norfolk and Suffolk Update

Dear IPT UK,

Thank you for sending me the contact details of other IPT people in the East Anglia region. I am in the process of contacting them with the aim of setting up a yearly regional IPT interest group and I hope to get information on regional developments for future regional reports.

With regard to Norfolk & Suffolk Mental Health Trust we have one supervisor/trainer Viktoria Cestaro and two further supervisors myself and Conrad Barnard. I believe we currently have 7 level B accredited therapists, 2 Level B and IPT A trained therapists and 1 IPT A therapist. We also have a number of people who have completed the five day introductory training, one of whom is completing her third case towards accreditation.

We hold quarterly IPT interests groups with a CPD element and monthly locality based supervision groups. There are also many individual supervision sessions being offered.

As you know last June Greg Hinrichsen came over to provide a two day intensive introductory training for 16 non-IAPT psychologists and psychotherapists. The aim of this training was for experienced therapists to learn the basics of the model. A number of attendees plan to go down the accreditation route and a number are taking on practice cases under supervision.

Also I'm assuming that you are aware of the IPC pilot in Suffolk & the plans for a comparison trial between IPT and CBT for 12 to 18 year olds in Norfolk & Suffolk. I am sure Ros is the best person to feedback further on this.

8. North West Report

- Dr Samantha Fitzpatrick took over from Mike Day in September 2016. Very unexpected as I (Sam F) was only hosting for Jennie Stanford or Jamie Barsky who couldn't make it! Anyway, I have hosted two meetings now, moving from a Knowsley venue to St Helens due to non-availability of Knowsley rooms but all agreed St Helens more central for people.
- Fairly well attended with average of figs at 16 attendees with apologies averaging six. Would value advice re widening attendance.
- CPD going well with previous talks on mentalisation and IPT, perinatal care and IPT, attachment theory and IPT plus an in-depth case study. CPD has been well received by all attendees. At our next event we will be learning about IPT and its application in an eating disorder service.
- We have set agenda points including training and supervision, IPTUK feedback, CPD and AOB.
- IPTUK training was discussed in our last meeting. We were grateful for the opportunity of supervision training arranged by Ros but unfortunately the feedback came that it had been offered a little too late in the day for most people although an IPT practitioner from Knowsley, Julie Mason, had taken up a place this year. Four people expressed an interest in attending training next year (if available). We discussed the commitment needed to attend supervisor training.
- Further training was considered and we would like to know if training for IPT-B or IPT for trauma might be available.
- Geographically, NW IPTUK feel a little disadvantaged as most training appears to be in the South. We often discuss whether speakers could make their way 'up North' to give a talk on a relevant subject.
- Attendees have expressed the usefulness of advanced top-up workshops and wondered whether any might be conducted 'up North'.
- Jamie Barsky is currently running course IPT-A in NW and we have Fiona Marshall training/trained in IPT-A supervision via IAPT funding in NW.
- Discussed IPTUK website – practitioners discussed NW IPTUK not registered on the website. We wondered what else may be on offer for practitioners to encourage them to register and pay the fee.
- In NW, we have PPN, run by Clare Baguley. I am in the process of contacting her re funding for IPT training/registration.
- From a personal point of view, I have moved from IAPT to an early intervention for first episode psychosis team and for this reason I am very interested in learning about how IPT for psychosis is developing via Prof Matthias. I have contacted him directly to discuss the project based at the University of Edinburgh. I would also be interested in learning more about IPSRT for bipolar affective disorder.

9. Surrey Report

The centre continues to provide supervision to people who are either practising IPT therapists or are conducting their practitioner/supervisor/group training. Due to previous low attendance and funding issues/staff time, a regional meeting has not taken place since the last IPT-UK meeting.

Training events

Susan Howard provided ran a level A training in Wales, staff members from a number of NHS Trusts attended. Another Level A course was provided by Susan Howard in Newcastle.

New training course

The University of Surrey has approved plans to provide a new part-time training for people without a core profession in mental health to train as an IPT therapists working with adults. This course will include training in core therapy skills.

10. South West Report

The SW Region has a monthly peer supervision groups throughout the SW.

1. Gloucestershire

The peer supervision group in Cheltenham , Gloucestershire is open to anyone trained in IPT and local enough to attend or call in. Current senior members cover specialties including Working Age Adult, Children and Young People Services, Eating Disorders, IAPT Let's Talk, Psychological Therapies and Primary Care and this has been facilitated by Julia Fox-Clinch since 2000. Julia always has a caseload of patients with Eating Disorders / Depression who benefit from IPT or IPT-A (12-20 sessions) or longer if IPT-M, and she works with patients in CYPS and Adult services. She is also researching the efficacy of group interpersonal psychotherapy; IPT- G for Binge Eaters, with her IPT and Senior Eating Disorders colleague Zoe Hepburn. This will be written up when sufficient groups have been run. We are currently recruiting for our fourth group and are getting promising results.
